

INFORMATION RESPONSIBLE TRAVELERS BEHAVIORS

PROTECTION TO THE ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL HERITAGE

- Dispose of trash in the containers provided for this purpose. If you visit nature destinations where
 there are no cups or other containers available, please store the waste until you find a suitable
 place.
- Separate solid waste where possible. This will allow establishments to recycle, taking advantage of waste for other uses.
- Make proper use of water. Avoid wasting this valuable resource.
- Do not contaminate water sources such as waterfalls, rivers, lakes and seas. Avoid throwing solid or liquid waste that affects water sources.
- If you visit places that are part of the natural heritage, comply with the rules established by each site. Avoid damaging, altering or otherwise affecting ecosystems and landscapes.

PROTECTION OF FLORA AND FAUNA

- Do not buy, retain or sell species of wild flora and fauna. This marketing is illegal and penalized by law.
- Never feed wild animals! Providing them with food creates dependence and alterations in the metabolism, this affects their natural behavior and causes them health problems.
- Contribute to the preservation of natural and cultural values by respecting local regulations and customs. Take only the photographs and leave the site exactly as you found it.

PROTECTION OF CULTURAL HERITAGE

- If you are traveling, make sure that the memories you bring from the destination are not part of the country's cultural heritage: monuments, archaeological elements, ruins, jewels, stones or other elements that are part of indigenous or prehistoric works.
- Do not destroy, remove, decorate or change any place that is part of the cultural heritage of the destination you visit.
- If you see someone dealing with cultural property, report it to the competent authorities first.
- Respect the culture of the communities you visit. Avoid mockery and acts that may offend people living in destinations.

PROTECTION OF CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS

Do not seek, use or promote sex tourism practices with minors. If you are witnessing any situation where the sexual exploitation of children is evident, report it to the appropriate authorities. This is a crime punishable by law.

ECONOMY

- Strengthen local commerce: Eat at local restaurants, shop at local markets and attend local events.
 Buy locally manufactured products to reduce pollution related to the import of goods. This way the money you spend remains in the community.
- Never buy handicrafts, clothing, furniture or other products derived from protected or endangered animal species. You may be subject to legal action if you buy products made from endangered species.
